# Ten For Ten Campaign

We launched the Ten for Ten Campaign, to raise funds to help a family with ten children, living in abject poverty in Tarlungeni, a Roma village near Sacele.

We are working in partnership with a local Romanian organisation called FAST. FAST supports children and families in Roma villages around Sacele, and wants to offer the people the chance to help themselves.

The father, of this particular family, Sorin, is desperate to work to be able to provide for each of his children, giving them a better start to life. Communities like his are often cut off from the local economy, and Sorin has been unable to find steady work, which obviously means his children are suffering too.

It will cost £2,500 to build a carpentry workshop, allowing Sorin to start a furniture business, meaning he could then support each of his children. His children may even be able to take over the business in the future, so this is a project that will have a lasting impact through the generations.

The "Ten for Ten" Campaign comes from the idea that if 250 people each give ten pounds, then these ten children will be helped. Our flyer is on the last page. We really need help with letting people know about this appeal. Could you help by passing the flyer on?

★The Need: The children's father, Sorin, will be able to provide for them if he has the chance to work. He will then be able to support each of his children and give them a better start to life.

★The Challenge: The carpentry workshop will cost £2,500.
