Supporting ORT SA CAPE

ORT SA CAPE is a non-profit organisation in Cape Town. Its programmes focus on giving a good quality education to children from disadvantaged communities. Previously, CHW's supporters have contributed towards ORT SA CAPE's science and robotics workshops for underprivileged children and teenagers. They have also donated towards teacher training in various fields, such as literacy, LEGO Six Bricks and PlayBox activities and the development of children's perceptual skills. The teacher training sessions benefit many children as the teachers can implement the new techniques they have learned with their current class and can continue to do so throughout their career.

On #GivingTuesday, GlobalGiving is holding a special fundraising challenge, where all donations will be partially matched. Become a #GivingTuesday Ambassador!

If you would like to help support this campaign by telling more people about it, this could be for you! The secret to a successful campaign is.... YOU and your network. Below are the steps it takes to effectively spread the word, and support this project for the children!

Step 1: Make a Network Map

This is like a mindmap. You draw a circle in the centre of a piece of paper, representing yourself. Draw lines coming out of the circle for each area of your life, eg current job, former job, travel, hobby, religious community, school, university, family, friends etc. This is a diagram of your whole network. You can then easily see which people you could reach out to about this campaign.

Step 2: Have a message to share

The following can be shared with your friends and contacts. The first paragraph would be fine for a status on Facebook and all the paragraphs together could form an email. There is a space for you to say why you support this project, if you wish. Personalisation can make a message more powerful.

On #GivingTuesday, 3 December, you can make a real impact for disadvantaged children in Cape Town by supporting their education. GlobalGiving is running a fundraising challenge and if at least 20 people make a donation through CHW's page, bonus funds could be won, so your help will go extra far this week! Also, all contributions will be partially matched on the day. <https://www.globalgiving.org/21813> Donations can be made any time from 5 am (GMT) and the campaign runs for 24 hours, so your donations will make a massive difference during this time!

Any contributions you make will go towards science and literacy workshops for children and teachers in very disadvantaged areas of Cape Town, run by the local organisation, ORT SA CAPE. The children go to under-resourced schools and ORT SA CAPE's workshops allow them to gain exposure to science and technology through doing robotics and visiting the Cape Town Science Centre. The teacher training sessions enable teachers to learn about new techniques, including the use of LEGO resources in the classroom, to help children to develop a variety of skills. The teachers will be able to deliver a better quality education to each child they work with.

I am supporting this project because...

Step 3: Share your message with individual people

Whilst sharing a general status on social media can sometimes work, the most effective way to fundraise is to send a personal message, email or even make a phone call to the people you have identified in your network map. Whilst you may get some "likes" or even "shares" online, people are much more likely to contribute if you have taken the time to reach out personally. This may mean copying and pasting your message and personalising it with a few details, but people will appreciate it more!

Step 4: Keep people updated!

If one of your contacts does make a contribution, and lets you know, be sure to thank them and also keep them updated with how the campaign is going. There will be updates on CHW's Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/ChildrensHelpersWorldwide>) and the results of the campaign will be shared there too, once #GivingTuesday is over.
